

From The Pastor... on Tools of the Trade

Pastors are unique among professionals in that they have very few visible tools of the trade. Health care workers enter a room with their stethoscopes, their blood pressure cuffs, and all the high-tech paraphernalia of medical science. Teachers relate to their students with the support of textbooks, computers, and web pages. Business people relate to clients with sales data, profit projections, and statistics.

Ministers, on the other hand, enter into relationships with very little technological gadgetry, and what high-tech tools we have (i.e. cell phones) tend to get in the way of meaningful conversations. What ministers do have are ears to listen, stories to share, and questions to ask. Above all, ministers offer a presence in times of need. Often words fail, but a presence never fails. A presence often says more than words can convey.

These tools of the trade are tools we all have. That is one reason we speak of the "ministry of the laity." All of us are ministers, and we can all listen, tell stories, and ask questions. We can listen actively. This is one of the most important ministries of the church, especially during times of transition.

I have found over the years that a congregation that nurtures the art of listening also prays well, sings well, and acts decisively. Perhaps that is due to the fact that in listening to each other, we discover that we are also listening to the Spirit who inspires, encourages, and empowers us.

The Thursday group is comprised of both men and women and meets from 6-7 on Thursdays beginning Sept 11. The Thursday group will be reading and discussing *Desire of the Everlasting Hills* by Thomas Cahill. This book is a part of a series which Cahill calls The Hinges of History, in which he explores "crucial turning points in the formation of Western culture." In this book Cahill shows Jesus from his birth to his execution through the eyes of those who knew him and in the context of his time. Both books are available on Amazon.com.

- ▼ Rally Day will be September 7, we will kick off the school year with a pizza lunch after service.
- → The month of September" will feature music of Felix Mendelssohn. Mendelssohn's grandfather was a rabbi and one of the founders of the Reform movement in Germany. Felix was baptized Lutheran, and spent a great part of his life trying to reconcile his Jewish roots with his Christian faith. His seminal work is the Oratorio *Elijah*, which focuses on Resurrection themes within an Old Testament framework. Our selections this month will include music from *Elijah*, as well as from the Psalms, organ sonatas and Songs Without Words.

▼ International Ministries Offering in September

The International Offering in September will go to support our missionaries, Drs. David and Laura Parajon. They work in Nicaragua with AMOS Health and Hope which is a Christian organization that exists to improve the health of impoverished communities by working alongside them in health, education and development.

AMOS is an acronym that stands for A Ministry Of Sharing, and is also named for the prophet Amos because of his special sensitivity for the poor. As Co-Directors of AMOS Health and Hope, they are dedicated to working towards health for all, because no child, rich or poor, should die of a preventable disease.

Their work covers a community of about 14,065 people. The impact they are making in this community is remarkable, for example, in the year 2012-2013, they achieved a 0 percent maternal mortality, a feat not achieved by many local communities or countries, saving many lives.
