

### From The Pastor ...

There are two basic ways a congregation can spend the interim time between settled pastors. The first is what I would term "reclining." It is the easy chair model of relaxing, asking the Search Committee to go out and find a pastor, and then waiting until the new pastor comes to set a course of action and implement it.

The other way a congregation can spend the time between settled pastors is what I would call a "Pathfinder" model. A pathfinder moves ahead, cautiously of course, but still moves ahead. A pathfinder looks at the terrain and determines which path the group should follow into the future.

In Baptist polity, the whole congregation is the pathfinder! The all-church retreat on January 31 is decisive in setting the direction of FBCIA in the future. Just as the church will have questions for any potential settled pastor, any prospective pastor will also want to ask questions of the church. Chief among those questions is, "What do you see as the strengths of the church, and what direction in ministry do you want to go?" To be able to give a clear answer to such questions is critically important.

## In Memory Of



**Evelyn Kinnaird Fox**, aged 89, died in hospice care on January 9, 2015. Evelyn was a member of the church fifty-four years. She and her husband Russell Fox joined FBCIA by letter on November 16, 1960. They moved from Wilkinsburg, Pennsylvania, (just outside of Pittsburgh) to Providence when Russell came to work for the Gorham Manufacturing Company. Both became pillars in the church, serving in one capacity after another, year after year. Evelyn variously was a member of the Board of Deacons, P&S, Missions, Christian Education, Member-at-Large of the Executive Committee, and a number of minor committees. She was one of those people who could always be counted on to do whatever was needed.

Evelyn was born at home on August 5, 1925 in Metcalf County, Kentucky, the daughter of Stewart Mitchell & Ernestine (Wallace)

Kinnaird. She and her older sister lived on the family farm the first few years, attending a one -room schoolhouse when Evelyn first began school. After graduating from Glasgow (KY) High School, Evelyn went to the University of Louisville, graduating with a B.S. degree in elementary education. She taught several years in the Louisville area. There she met Russell, and they were married on June 30, 1951, beginning a forty-two year marriage that ended when Russell died from a stroke on January 22, 1994. Their first daughter, Mary Kay was born in 1956 while the Foxes were still in Louisville, and Anne was born in Pittsburgh in 1959. The girls grew up at FBCIA before going out into the world to their respective careers. Anne became a lawyer in Manhattan, NY, and Mary Kay trained to be an actor using Kinnaird as her professional name, but she later became involved in the real estate business. After her children were born, Evelyn did not hold a teaching position while her girls were growing up. Finally, she taught ten years in the Barrington Early Childhood Center, retiring in 1985. She said that while teaching at the Center did not pay much, she "loved it." In October 2013, she moved to New York City to be near her daughter.

She is survived by her sister Vivian and a brother Samuel Kinnaird and his wife Pat, two daughters, Mary Kinnaird and Anne (Fox) Cutler and son-in-law Stuart Cutler, and five grandchildren.
