

Meet our missionary Kristy Engel



Kristy Engel is a pediatric nurse practitioner with a special interest in nutrition issues facing children. For 12 years, she worked in La Romana, Dominican Republic with medical mission teams, including volunteers from our church who spent time there. Kristy then became the Healthcare Relief Resource missionary for Iberoamérica and the Caribbean. In that capacity, she worked with David and Laura Parajón, profiled in last month's Spire. This year, she has been appointed International Ministries' first global consultant for health care. Her role is to help bring medical relief to poor areas by building relationships and providing care in clinics, during natural disasters and with program develop-

ment. Kristy continues to live by her saying, "Do what you can, with what you've got, in the moment you are given" by using her gifts to bring hope to those in the most critical health care situations around the world.

Special Giving Opportunity starting April 15th

This Spring, International Ministries (IM) will offer donors a way to double their gifts to Kristy Engel and other IM missionaries like the Parajón family in Nicaragua. The donations that are given during this time are used to reach fundraising goals that help pay salaries, allow mission-

You can also sign-up to be an ongoing supporter, even for \$10, \$25 or \$50 a month. By having regular, ongoing monthly support, our missionary ambassadors can focus time on serving overseas and sharing the health care ministry that they are called to provide.

Please remember: the matching grant begins April 15th and donations must be labeled "Matching Grant for Kristy Engels's Support" or "Matching grant for David and Laura Parajón's Support" to qualify for this doubling.
