

The only other option is to continue on to 195 east to India Street exit. turn left on Wickenden and right on South Main. Again, out of way but will not have any blockages to get to your church.

Memorial Blvd is a mess on those days and there is no way to cross it. I'm sorry for the trouble but if you can put into a bulletin these other options at least people can be prepared and have a slightly longer yet less stressful ride to church.

For program of September 25, 2015 Are you in the mood for a trip to someplace new and different, then come along on FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 25, 2015 when Sue Lepore takes us to a wonderful vacation spot – the GALAPAGOS ISLANDS.



The Galapagos, a group of 19 islands approximately 600 miles off the coast of Ecuador were discovered accidentally in 1535 by Spaniard Fray Tomas de Berlanga, the Bishop of Panama. He spent most of three days searching for water on the islands. He wrote that the land there, inhabited only by birds, seals, and reptiles was "dross, worthless, because it has not the power of raising a little grass, but only some thistles." Charles Darwin sailed there aboard the HMS Beagle in 1835. He spent 5 weeks exploring the islands at the end of a 3-year journey charting the coasts of South America. He was impressed with the ability of the animals to adapt to the harsh and different conditions on each island.


