FROM THE PASTOR

The first Sunday in March, the Reverend Kathryn Palen led us in a workshop regarding our wishes surrounding our deaths. She offered a number of resources to help order your thoughts and prompts to begin conversations with your loved ones. (One my favorite suggestions is to arrange for a "last supper" where you discuss your wishes with your family.) If you did not receive the materials, I have more copies in my office that I can give to you. We cannot control our deaths, but we can prepare as much as possible. Who will make decisions for you, if you are unable to do so for yourself? What kind of medical treatment do you want? What do you want your loved ones to know? In conjunction with this, our sermons leading up to Easter encouraged us to have meaningful conversations with loved ones before death. Perhaps you need to ask for or offer forgiveness, express gratitude or love. This is the time to do so. If you would like to discuss your wishes with me, I welcome the conversation. It is never too early to plan for your funeral. (I'm not rushing anyone, but ready or not, the day will come.) Additionally, we would like to keep contact information updated in the office, in the event of an emergency. Perhaps you live alone or far from family. You could let your neighbors know where you attend church, and if they were concerned about you, they would know to contact us on your behalf. Forms will be available in the church office. If you think talking about death is difficult, remember that not talking about it is even harder. You don't need to do this by yourself. Give yourself and your loved ones the gift of peace of mind, and begin getting ready today.
