February is the month to Blanket the World with Love



For more than 70 years, Church World Service has worked in partnership with communities in distress to identify needs and access the resources they require to build the foundation for a more viable future. These resources include blankets, tents and food. CWS aid has been invaluable to individuals suffering during disasters.

In 2021, congregational gifts provided over 183,000 blankets and kits to families impacted by hurricanes, tornadoes, flooding and other crises (including homelessness and poverty). Our church is one of 8,000 congregations across the United States that will sponsor a Blanket Month, providing funds to help people in need around the world. \$50 can provide five warm blankets for a family left homeless by a tornado or other disaster. \$110 can provide an emergency food package for a family of five for one month. \$250 can stock shelves with blankets in a shelter as wintry lows hit.
