Among RECONPAZ's goals are: to protect humans rights and integral ecology; to investigate and denounce those who originate violence beyond their borders; to educate and inspire the defense of life: to advocate for the use of arts and social media to denounce violence; to move churches and believers to defend human rights and integral ecology. Based in Guatemala, where he works close-

ly with the Ecumenical Christian Council of Guatemala, Ricardo promotes RECONPAZ's goals for peace and justice throughout the continent. Additionally, he invites and works with International Ministries partners whose goals and ideals align with the Continental Christian Network for Peace.

He is a tireless advocate for peace with justice for the earth and all its inhabitants. Learn firsthand about how your mission offerings are turned into practical ministry on the ground in Latin America through the efforts of Ricardo Mayol-Bracero and other mission partners and how you can further support this work.
